This year, in addition to the extra love, attention and treats for my four felines, I will also give them extra security by getting them microchipped. A microchip will make a huge difference in their well-being, and give us peace of mind.

I admit that this has been on my "to-do" list for quite some time, but I've put it off for various reasons. Now, I'm going to practice what I preach and get them chipped.

If you too, have considered microchipping for your animal companion, mark your calendar for Feb. 27 and plan to attend the first Coalition for Pet Protection chip clinic. CPP has always had the health and safety of animals as a top priority.

This event will be in a clean, secure facility, and the procedure will be done by a licensed, trained veterinarian. The chip clinic will be at Parkview Animal Hospital, 3201 S. Tenth St., from 9 a.m. to noon Feb. 27. Chips will be \$25, and a multiple-pet discount is available for up to two additional animals. (Cash only.)

Lifetime registration will be handled at the time, and is included in the price. There will also be extra goodies for those attending. For more information call the hotline at (402) 434-7922.
