We currently assist with emergency medical care for felines, and supply animal food for hundreds of households per year.

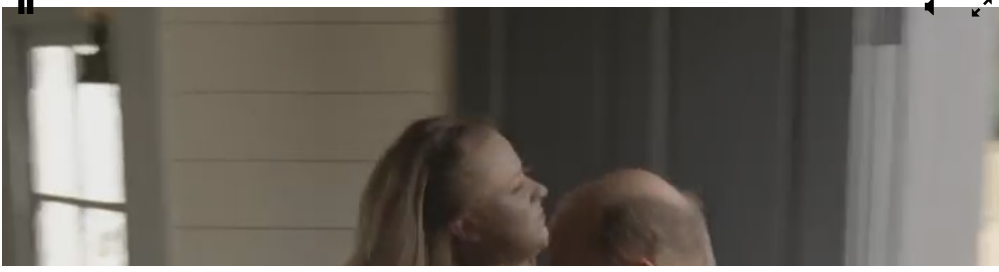
Two recent cases reflect the importance of our mission. CPP has been helping a person in hospice care, supplying food and supplies to his dogs. These are delivered to the household as needed. The caregivers have commented on how this has helped the patient in terms of his emotional health.

A recent call to the hotline turned into transporting a very sick cat to the hospital. The client had very limited funds, and was also dealing with some difficult issues herself.

CPP helped with getting the cat immediate medical care. The client expressed such gratitude and relief that she was getting such quick and effective help. She had been so scared, and felt so much better with knowing her cat would get better.

These are just two of many cases that CPP handles throughout the year. We are an all-volunteer group, operating only on donations of money and food.
